VALENTINA. (Suddenly frightened that Terry is about to reveal something untoward.) Terry, my friend, you don't owe any explanation. Please don't say any ... TERRY. I have been hosting "the girl within" more years than even you, Amy. Before I found another like me, homosexuals were the only friends I had. Among them I found support, acceptance, and encouragement. For years I've attended their balls and clubs and parties. Well, we all do. And aren't we always welcome? Homosexuals accepted me, even as a heterosexual man, without judgement or malice. And, for the record, not once did I have to fend off unwanted attention. I owe a great debt of gratitude to them. I'm not telling anyone else what to do, but I cannot sign a piece of paper purposely excluding them. And I should add, if creating this organization is truly a step ahead, then I think it is morally wrong not to extend that leg up to our sister transvestites in the homosexual world. I cannot imagine they wouldn't do the same for us. VALENTINA. Terry, you'd be fine if the resort were to fill up with homosexuals? TERRY. I imagine homosexuals have many more fun places to go than the Catskills. CHARLOTTE. And if it meant a night in jail? Must I remind you that sodomy is a punishable crime.
